Eternal Karmayogi

Session By Radha Chauhan Ma'am (IAS Retd.)

At the start of the second week, Officer Trainees had the privilege of interacting with **Ms. Radha Chauhan, IAS (Retd.)**, who shared her rich tapestry of experiences gathered over a distinguished career — from serving as SDM in Uttar Pradesh, to steering the Digital India initiative in its formative years, and leading the digitisation of the Government e-Marketplace (GeM) portal.

True to her dynamic style, Ma'am began the session with demand-side prioritisation — inviting questions from the audience and weaving her insights around their curiosity. What followed was an inspiring, interactive journey through themes that resonate deeply with every aspiring civil servant — overcoming self-doubt, maintaining long-term motivation, tackling gender bias, and choosing between the "right" and the "more right."

Her anecdotes brought the lessons alive — like how GeM became a tool of women's empowerment by enabling rural women in Jharkhand to access self-employment opportunities through digital platforms.

Her words lingered long after the session ended:

"Gender bias has declined in civil services, but cultural bias continues to persist; civil servants can counter it through community engagement."

As he spoke, time seemed to pause. He shared tales of zero gravity and infinite dreams, of gazing at Earth from afar — fragile, blue, and breathtaking — and of carrying the tricolour to the stars. But beyond the science and the spacecraft, it was his humility that truly soared. Between stories of the Axiom mission and reflections on discipline, courage, and teamwork, he reminded everyone that the real journey begins within.

The officer trainees listened — awestruck, wide-eyed, and inspired — as he said with a quiet smile, "The sky was never the limit." It wasn't just a line; it was a revelation.

When the talk ended, he didn't walk away like a celebrity — he stayed back like a mentor. From selfies to group photos with all four houses, Group Captain Shukla turned Tarang Hall into a constellation of shared joy and aspiration.

For the OTs, it was a once-in-a-lifetime moment — to meet someone who had literally been beyond the sky yet remained so grounded. As he left, one couldn't help but feel that the universe had just whispered a gentle reminder:

Dream higher, stay humble, and remember — even the stars look up to those who dare.
