Research Papers	Up to 4,000 words	Original empirical, doctrinal, theoretical, comparative, or policy research supported by appropriate methodology and evidence.
Articles	Up to 3,000 words	Substantive analytical contributions on significant policy, regulatory, institutional, financial, or sectoral issues.
Case Studies	Up to 2,500 words	Documented analysis of a specific policy, programme, institution, or implementation experience, with lessons of wider relevance.
Commentaries	Up to 1,500	Concise, evidence-based perspectives on current developments, policies, or emerging debates.

Book Reviews	Up to 1,000 words	Critical reviews of recent academic publications relevant to the Journal's thematic focus.

What we look for: a clearly defined research question or issue; originality; engagement with relevant literature or policy material; sound methodology or analysis; and clear implications for policy, regulation, governance, or practice, where relevant.

Submission Guidelines

1. **Originality:** All submissions must be original, unpublished work not currently under review elsewhere. Authors must submit the signed Author Declaration Certificate (Annexure I).
2. **Manuscript Format:** Times New Roman, 12 point, double-spaced, justified alignment. Submit as a Microsoft Word (.docx) file.
3. **Referencing:** APA 7th edition style must be used consistently, including in-text citations and the reference list. For formatting and examples, see the official [APA sample papers](#) and the APA guidance on [footnotes and page order](#) (footnotes should be used sparingly, only for supplementary content or copyright attribution — never as a substitute for in-text citation).
4. **Abstract & Keywords:** Include an abstract of 150-250 words followed by 4-6 keywords.
5. **Covering Letter:** Must identify the corresponding author with full contact and institutional details, the manuscript category, word count, and relevant disclosures (Annexure II).
6. **Double-Blind Submission:** The manuscript file must not contain the author's name, affiliation, acknowledgements, or other identifying information; author details go in the covering letter only.
7. **Figures, Tables & Permissions:** Follow APA 7 guidelines; images at a minimum of 300 dpi. Authors are responsible for obtaining permission to reproduce any copyrighted third-party material and for acknowledging the source.
8. **Language:** Manuscripts must be in English. Authors whose first language is not English are encouraged to have their manuscript professionally edited before submission.
9. **Ethics, Authorship & Disclosures:** Manuscripts involving human participants or sensitive data must comply with applicable ethical requirements. All listed authors must have made a substantive contribution and approved the submission. Authors must disclose any conflicts of interest

and any funding or institutional support received.

10. **Numerals & Units:** Spell out numbers one to nine; use figures for 10 and above, except for exact measurements (e.g., 3 km, 9%). Usage of Numerals, unit and currency should be uniform throughout the manuscript.

Use of Artificial Intelligence & AI-Assisted Tools

Authors must disclose any use of generative AI or AI-assisted tools in preparing the manuscript. AI tools must not replace the author's responsibility for the originality, accuracy, or conclusions of the work, and any AI-assisted material must be verified by the authors. AI tools cannot be listed as authors. Where used, authors should briefly state the nature and purpose of that use in the covering letter.

Review & Editorial Process

All manuscripts undergo double-blind peer review, in which the identities of authors and reviewers remain confidential throughout. Manuscripts are assessed on originality, rigour, relevance to the Journal's scope, clarity, and quality of writing. The Editorial Board reserves the right to desk-reject manuscripts that do not conform to these guidelines or fall outside the Journal's thematic scope. Following review, manuscripts may be accepted, accepted subject to revisions, or rejected; the final decision rests with the Editorial Board.

Plagiarism & Research Integrity

The Journal of Communications Finance is committed to publishing original, high-quality research and maintains a strict policy against plagiarism in all its forms. All submitted manuscripts will be subjected to plagiarism screening using standard detection software prior to peer review. Kindly note:

7. A similarity index of more than 10% (excluding references, bibliography, and quoted material) will render the manuscript liable to rejection.
8. Authors are expected to properly cite and acknowledge all sources.
Manuscripts found to contain plagiarised content at any stage will be rejected or retracted.

How to Submit

Each submission must include the following three documents, sent together in a single email as attachments:

- **The Manuscript:** the full text, submitted as a Microsoft Word (.docx) file, anonymised for double-blind review.
- **The Covering Letter (Annexure II):** addressed to the Editor-in-Chief,

confirming the manuscript has not been submitted elsewhere and including the corresponding author's details, manuscript category, word count, and disclosures.

- **The Signed Author Declaration Certificate (Annexure I):** print, sign, scan, and attach. Submissions without a signed declaration will not be processed.

 - Signed Author Declaration Certificate (Annexure I) is attached.
 - All three submission documents are being sent together in a single email.
